

#### **Attendance**

Our whole school attendance for last week was 95.7% which is unfortunately below our target! Let's see if we can get that back up next week.

## Over the last week at Beechwood.....

Foundation Stage have been on a scavenger hunt in the outside area. They have looked for and found pictures related to their story, 'We're Going On A Bear Hunt' and used their phonics knowledge to write labels. They have made bear hunt collaged maps and bear masks. In English they have written captions using positional language. In maths sessions they have been adding 1 more and 1 less up to 5.

Years 1 and 2 have started their English unit on Stickman this week. They have been exploring the story in depth and next week they will be applying this into their writing. Year 2 are subtracting numbers in maths this week and Year 1 have moved on to learning about 2D shape. In science Year 1 have been looking at seasonal changes and Year 2 have been learning about the scientist John Dunlop and have been experimenting with which materials would be best to make a tyre with.

Year 3 are continuing their multiplication and division unit in maths, focusing on division this week. In RE they are looking at how Christians celebrate Christmas and their own winter celebrations. They are looking forward to their trip to Butser Ancient Farm on Friday.

Year 4 have been completing assessments this week and the staff are very proud of all the children and the effort they have put in. The children have continued the anti-bullying theme and extended this to cyber bullying, where the children have learnt that words matter even if written not said. The children are looking forward to their visit to Butser Farm on Friday. We look forward to seeing you bright and early at 8.10am!

Year 5 are busy completing their assessments in maths, reading and writing skills this week. In the afternoons, they have been continuing their fitness and gymnastics lessons in PE and have enjoyed learning about different punishments from the Tudor and Stuart periods. Towards the end of the week, the children will be starting their science unit all about forces and are very excited ahead of their trip to the Science Centre next week.


Year 6 have been exploring methods to multiply and divide fractions during their maths lessons. In English, they have been independently writing a biography linked to Black History Month and have been enjoying reading Pig Heart Boy in Whole Class Reading. In RE they have been learning about Christianity and are exploring why Mary was chosen to be Jesus' mother. They are also enjoying their art lessons, where they are using their sketching skills to draw blood cells.
