Over the last week at Beechwood......

Foundation Stage have continued learning about people who help them. On Thursday they will be visited by a staff from a local vet. In maths sessions they have started to learn about 3d shapes and their properties. In English they have discussed the story of "Traction Man" and talked about the vocabulary used within it. The children photographed props in action packed poses on the iPad to support parts of the story.

Years 1 & 2 have been learning about food chains in science this week to conclude their unit of learning about animals. In English they have been writing a letter to a school child in Kenya to compare the similarities and differences between their school days. In maths both year groups are moving on to looking at length and height.

Year 3 have been learning line dancing in P.E. this half term. As a year group they successfully performed a line dance maintaining neat rows. In maths they have been looking at mass and capacity, becoming more confident in comparing and converting measurements. In art the children have finished creating a rainforest inspired camouflage art piece.

Year 4 have begun their English unit on fantasy stories. They are using a film as their inspiration and are looking forward to writing their stories next week. In P.E. the children are looking forward to playing a competitive game of handball and showing off their dance skills to round off their dance unit. In maths the children have been adding and subtracting fractions and are continuing to learn their times tables.

Year 5 enjoyed taking part in their science week activities. In maths the children are continuing to look at area of shapes and in English they are researching facts about the Spanish Armada to enable them to write their independent newspaper reports. The children are now coming to the end of their swimming lessons and have made fantastic progress.


Year 6 had a wonderful time at the French Cafe and were very competitive when building their structures. In English the children have been completing an independent narrative write based on Chapter 5 of Oh Maya Gods. In maths, they have completed their percentages unit and are now moving on to area, perimeter and volume. During science Week, Year 6 identified that there was a correlation between hand span and the number of sweets they could pick up in one attempt.
