Handy Club will be closed on Monday 18th & Wednesday 20th due to parents evening.


# **British Science Week**

### Over the last week at Beechwood......

Foundation Stage have continued learning about "People who help us". On Thursday they will be visited by a doctor's surgery who will answer questions direct from the children about the different roles they all have there. They have drawn pictures of their favourite person who helps us. In maths sessions they have continued learning about number bonds to 10 and have also consolidated doubling facts and odd and even numbers. As it's science week the children have conducted an enquiry-based experiment to see if hand span has an effect on how many sweets they can pick up.

Years 1 & 2 have been enjoying being scientists this week, they had a great time doing our whole school science week experiment and Year 1 had lots of fun exploring 'animal poo' to discover which animals were carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. In english we have been writing passionate speeches to persuade people to stop poaching The Big 5 African animals!

Year 3 have been busy with lots of science this week! They have made their own bionic hands to show how the bones, tendons, muscles and skin work together in hands to move. They have also completed an investigation into whether their dominant or non-dominant hands can pick up more sweets. In maths, they have moved onto mass and capacity, learning how to read scales. In art they have used time and focus to carefully create a camouflage background for their final art piece.

Year 4 have been learning about equivalent fractions on a number line in maths. In english, they have been writing a persuasive brochure to entice people to visit Sicily. In PHSE they have been learning about friendships and in RE they have studied forgiveness in Christianity. During geography they have learnt how to use the eight compass points for directions and in PE they have been playing handball.

Year 5 have started new units in both maths and English this week. In maths, they have have been looking at how to measure perimeter of rectilinear shapes and in english, the children are exploring the features of a newspaper report, so they can begin to create their own report of a Tudor event. In art, we have been focusing on Tudor portraits and the use of symbolism in artwork, especially on portraits of Queen Elizabeth I. The children are really enjoying their topic on The Tudors and we are seeing great results in their work!


Year 6 have been busy starting a new topic in english using our book, 'Oh, Maya Gods!'. The children will be concentrating on a narrative piece of writing that will contain suspense - we can't wait to read them! In the meantime, we are looking at characterisation and description to build up our writing skills. In maths we have been working on percentages. The children have been fantastic in this unit. The biggest excitement this week has been science Week. We are carrying out an investigation and the children will be using that information to create scatter graphs.
