# Over the last week at Beechwood.....

Foundation Stage have been learning about pirates. They have made telescopes, eyepatches, hats and treasure maps. In maths sessions they have been consolidating their number bonds to five and inverse number problems. In english they have been writing simple sentences about a pirate scene.

Years 1 & 2 have been working really hard practising their phonics and reading ahead of the phonics screening next week. In maths they are moving on to place value to 100. Year 2 have been busy recapping fractions and the grammar they have learnt over the year ahead of their SATS next week. In science, Year 1 and 2 have been enjoying learning about spring and finding different signs of spring in the environment.

Year 3 have been AMAZING this week as they have had to cope with lots of changes of adults whilst their teachers are supporting the Year 6 residential - we are so proud of you Year 3! In maths, they are learning about angles and turns and enjoyed making their turn-o-meters. In english, they have been exploring when to use "a" or "an" correctly and they will be learning how to identify the simple tenses. In computing they have started their programming unit on Scratch learning how to move a sprite.

Year 4 have been learning about different types of angles in maths. In english they are looking at poetry. They have started a new geography unit on the United Kingdom and in PE they are playing tennis and athletics. In PSHE they have started talking about how children are physically similar to their birth parents.

Year 5 had the amazing opportunity to participate in a collaboration with Reading University and were introduced to weaving. The students were able to create their own piece of woven fabric, which they enjoyed. In english, year 5 pupils have started their work on debating which links into art and exploring graffiti as art and as vandalism. They have been studying The Boy at the Back of the Class, which has had a profound effect on some of our pupils, especially as we have explored what a refugee is.


Year 6 are having a wonderful activities week both at Ferny Crofts and at school. They are developing important life skills such as resilience, teamwork, independence and determination, whilst having lots of fun. At Ferny Crofts the children are challenging themselves on high ropes, shooting and scavenger hunts.
