Over the last week at Beechwood......

Foundation Stage have continued their learning on 'The Enormous Turnip'. They are experts at retelling the story using actions and have written a simple version of the story! Their class caterpillars have now transformed into chrysalis' and they are keeping their fingers crossed that the butterflies will emerge by the end of the week! The children have been creating beautiful pieces of artwork based on the artist Eric Carle. In maths they have been learning about sharing.

Years 1 & 2 have been working hard to grow their beans over the last few weeks and have got some impressive results. They have been updating their bean diaries with the progress. In English this week the children are learning about the different jobs in a castle and later in the week they will be applying for a job and interviewing for the roles. Next week they will be writing fact files about the different jobs.

Year 3 have been learning about newspaper articles in English and having a go at writing catchy headlines with alliteration. In maths, they have been working hard to learn how to tell time on an analogue and a digital clock. In science they have been working on displaying data they have collected as a bar chart. Finally, in reading they have been enjoying reading their new book: Atticus and the Ancient Greeks.

Year 4 are learning about the Viking justice system in history and how some of the punishments didn't really fit the crime. They will be deciding if some of the Viking laws and punishments were 'Fair or Foul'. In art, the children will be studying works by the artist Steve Brown and how he uses lines and colour to create flow and texture. In computing, the children are learning how to manipulate and change a photograph using software provided.

Year 5 have enjoyed using Shakespearean insults in their English lessons this week! In maths that they have been learning about translation in shapes, and in art they have started to create their own Tudor portrait.



Nearly done - phew! During their afternoons they are enjoying their art sessions, where they are developing printing techniques and are in the process of designing their own mountain scene to print. In PE they had fun learning some basic dance moves from the 70s and choreographing their own routines.
