Over the last week at Beechwood, and looking forward.....

Foundation Stage— Butterflies have been learning all about owls and nocturnal animals this week. In drawing club we drew an owl and wrote the magic code of 'sit'. In maths we have been looking at the number 5 and the numbers that make up 5. We have also been learning about circles and triangles.

Year 1— In English we have been writing about the vintage children's cartoon 'Mr Benn'. In Maths we have been learning to recognise and sort 3D shapes. In Computing the children have made fantastic progress over this half term with developing their digital painting skills. This week they have created pictures in a style of Kandinsky by drawing/designing circle shapes and filling them in with different colours. Next week in Maths we will finish with 2D shapes and do revision of addition and subtraction within 10. In English we will work on a story of 'A Little Bit Brave'.

Year 2— In Year 2 we have begun reading a new book which we will be using in our English lessons, Harvey Slumfenburger's Christmas Present! In Maths we are learning to subtract 2 digit numbers crossing 10. We have been solving problems using practical resources and are now writing subtraction problems using the column method. In Geography we have looked at how people travel about in London and in Science we have been comparing features of different seasons. The children have begun eagerly practicing their Nativity which they will be performing to parents during the last week of term. Your child will have brought their lines home, so please help them to learn these.

Year 3— Year 3's week has been a whirlwind of Christmas cheer—advent calendars, cheeky elf tales and classroom giggles. We're exploring a UK topographical map in Geography, counting to 20 and practising greetings in French, and polishing expanded noun phrases in English. In Maths we've moved on to multiplication, using arrays to visualise the facts.


Year 4— Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed their swimming session this week. They learned some vital life saving skills and are showing huge improvements in their swimming ability. In Science we continue learning about sound and how sound waves can move. We will be planning our very own Pod Cast this week in computing, the children will need to think carefully about a topic for their podcast and 5 key points they would like to discuss.

Year 5— Year 5 enjoyed a fun science lesson, exploring the effects of water resistance. In maths, the children have finished their unit on fractions (finally!) and will now be going back to multiplication and division to consolidate their learning.

Year 6— In Year 6, we have been writing a flashback narrative based on WW2 and the battle for Europe. We are continuing to read 'Pig Heart Boy' by Malorie Blackman - learning that Cam, the main character, will need a heart transplant. This links to our current Science topic where we have been learning the parts and functions of the circulatory system including the heart.
