
ATTENDANCE AWARD:

Over the last week at Beechwood......

Foundation Stage have been learning all about Harvest this week and had a wonderful time at the Church on Monday. We have also been exploring the book 'The Gruffalo' and today made a delicious Gruffalo crumble. Tomorrow we will be talking through the steps that we used to make it. We have also been busy this week for enterprise week, we have worked hard making seed bombs and look forward to selling them on Friday in Butterflies' garden!

Year 1 have learnt what human features (such as shops, schools, bridges etc) are in geography and then children worked in small teams and made some of these features out of junk modelling. In Maths we have been revising the Place Value unit and we are about to start Addition and Subtraction within 10. In Science we learnt about characteristics of different animals' groups like fish, amphibians, mammals, reptiles, insects and birds. Last week in PE we practised lots of gymnastics poses so we could be applying them whilst using equipment in our next sessions.

Year 2 have been learning to edit their work by reading over their writing and correcting any missing capital letters and full stops. We also looked at the features of posters before creating our own to advertise our 'Love-a-Toy' stall on Friday, which the children are very excited about! Please keep sending in any unwanted soft toys. In Maths we have started our new unit on addition and subtraction. In Science we evaluated our houses that we made last week and whether the materials we used had been more suitable than others.

Year 3 have been gearing up for Enterprise Week, getting ready to sell our handmade crafts at our stall on Friday. In English, we completed independent writing tasks where we wrote a full set of instructions on how to make our favourite sandwich. In Maths, we've started a new unit on Addition and Subtraction, focusing on number bonds within 10 and tackling problem-solving challenges. We've also been enjoying our Music a Day calendar, discovering songs from movies, and after a class vote, our favourites were the theme song to the original Superman and Jurassic Park. It's been a busy and fun-filled term for us so far!

Year 4 have been very busy this week making bookmarks for Enterprise Week. We have been coming up with some amazing designs and we hope they will sell well. We have had a much-anticipated time-traveller from Roman times visit us this week, telling us all about how the Romans lived in Brittania two thousand years ago and we had great fun dressing up as Romans too. In Maths, we have been adding 4-digit numbers. In English, we have been reading a non-chronological text about the Roman army. We have been finding out about prey, predators and producers in Science.

Year 5 have had a busy week! We had a fantastic and special Science lesson on Friday for World Space Week - a livestream lesson where we met Tim Peake and learnt all about the ISS. We had a fun time interacting and Mrs Caswell even got us a shout out from her sick bed! We have also been planning what we will investigate on our walk on Thursday. English has been great - the children have been making their own poems this week and we can't wait to see the finished poetry!

Year 6 have been creating our own creatures to have features of various animals in order to classify them on dichotomous keys. Within Art, we have been drawing life-like pictures of flies and in Music we are learning period music from WW2. Short and long division have been our focuses in Maths, following on from multiplication. We are also looking forward to our residential week next week with lots of talk about who we will be roomed with!
