Over the last week at Beechwood......

Foundation Stage have been investigating spiders and worms this week. We have learnt about why worms live underground and why spiders make their webs. We have also been super writers this week and started our new writing challenge, writing 'I can see...' sentences about what we can see in the garden. In Maths we have been learning about sharing into equal groups. We are also continuing to observe our caterpillars, which are now all in their cocoons as well as watching our beanstalks grow.

Year 1 have travelled to China today in English. The children learnt about a school day in China and compared it to a school day at Beechwood. In PSHE we discussed how balanced diet, sleep, drinking water and doing exercise keep us healthy. In Computing Robins learnt how to use some parts of the keyboard for removing and adding text.

Years 2 and 3 have followed on from writing to persuade holiday makers to go to Greece by writing to persuade people to come to Woodley! In Maths, Year 2 are continuing their unit on fractions while Year 3 have begun their unit on money. In Science we have looked at the different food groups that humans eat and analysed the nutrition labels on food packaging to see which foods are healthy. In Geography we have looked at the different landscapes in Greece.

Year 4 have been continuing their learning about decimals in Maths. We have began our independent writing in English about the story feast. We have been building circuits in Science and learnt what the key components of circuits are. In PE we have continued our learning of key skills used in Rounders.


Year 5 have been looking at life cycles in Science, comparing different cycles like amphibians and mammals to see the similarities and differences between then. In Maths, they have been using protractors to measure angles and have also looked at properties of 3D shapes. Finally, in History they have been looking at how the population of Reading has changed over the years.

Year 6 have started in English with planning an independent newspaper or live-blog piece of writing on Junko Tabei, the first woman to summit Everest. They continue to revise, practice exam technique and plug gaps of knowledge they have in Spelling, Grammar and Maths. In computing, they have been learning about copywriting and in French, pupils are on their way to giving directions to different shops and amenities in the town.
