## **Over the last week at Beechwood, and looking forward.....**

Foundation Stage — Butterflies have started their new topic of 'We Are Explorers', we are starting our unit by looking at different types of transport. In Drawing Club we have used the story '100 Decker Bus' and creating our own adventurous decks for our 'Butterflies Bus', we have had exciting things such as dragons, farms, jungles and more! In Maths we have started learning about the concept of 'zero' and will be consolidating our learning of numbers to 5 before moving to number 6. Please look out for information coming home about our Airport Day we will be having next week.

Year 1— In Maths we started a unit on a place value to 20. In a Drawing club this week we have been writing about a story of 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea'. In our outdoor PE we practised dribbling whilst learning what attackers' and defenders' roles are and indoors the children explored yoga and mindfulness today. In Computing the children predicted an outcome of a command on a robot device (a Bee-bot).

Year 2— This week Foxes class are recapping their grammar skills, using the correct punctuation for different sentence types. Next week will be starting our new English unit on animal fact files. In Maths we are looking at 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. Our topic this term is 'Carnival of the Animals' and we will be learning about animals and humans in Science as well as starting an exciting unit about Explorers in History.

Year 3— Year 3 have dived straight back into learning after the festivities of last term. We really enjoyed listening to everyone's news and hearing all about what they got up to over the holidays. This week in English, we have been recapping and focusing on grammar, and we began reading the first chapter of our new class reader Rainforests in 30 Seconds. In Maths, we are continuing our unit on multiplication and division. In Science, we will be exploring the parts and functions of a plant. We are looking forward to a busy and exciting term ahead.


Year 4— Year 4 have come back after the break with lots of energy for the New Year! We have dived into adventure tales in English and we are learning to create tension in our writing. In Maths, we are looking at finding factors in numbers and using them to help us multiply large numbers.

Year 5— Year 5 start this term exploring a new topic on rivers. Using rivers as their theme in English, they will develop their writing skills through the use of conjunctions. In maths, they learn more formal methods to multiply and divide to help them solve problems.

Year 6— Year 6 have started working on 'The Lost Thing' in their reading and English lessons. Within maths, students are learning about ratio and multiplication of fractions. We have learnt, this week, about climate change and we are learning about fossils and evolution within science lessons.
