Parking Concerns

Dear Parents and Guardians,

It is with growing concern that I write yet again to raise awareness of the risks posed by parents and guardians who continue to park in Ambleside Close, or drop off either on



Ambleside Close or in the turning circle at the top of the road. Over the last few days I have witnessed multiple altercations between drivers and residents and several near misses with cars stopping or moving off without properly looking.

The signs clearly state that there is no parking anywhere on Ambleside Close Monday - Friday 8am - 5pm and no stopping on the zig zag lines. The turning circle SHOULD NOT be used as a drop off area. This is not what it is designed for. Our local traffic warden has issued several tickets over the last few days and has assured us he will continue to do so.

Dropping off in the turning circle or parking / stopping on the pavement is extremely dangerous and I urge parents and guardians to use the Headley Road car park or the parking on Arundel Road.

ATTENDANCE

Our minimum attendance target is 96.5%. Please help us to ensure your child receives the best education by attending school regularly and being on time.

Our whole school attendance for the last week was 96.4% which is only just below our target and a good start.

Over the last week at Beechwood.....

Foundation Stage have enjoyed starting drawing club where we have been drawing Humpty Dumpty as well as thinking about how else the kings men can get to Humpty quickly. We have also been learning about parts of the body and have been drawing self portraits.

Year 1 have started our first transcription unit based on the book Monkey Puzzle in English. The children have been re-telling the story and writing labels, captions and lists for different animals. In Science we talked about our main body parts and labelled them on the human body outline. We enjoyed our music lessons, recognising different pitch and playing to different tempos.

Year 2 we have continued building our sentence writing skills in English, recognizing nouns, adjectives and verbs. In Maths we have been partitioning numbers to 100 using base ten. We had an exciting introduction to our Science unit of materials where the children drew 'material munching monsters' then found items made of their favourite food to eat! In History we have learned about the sequence of events that led to and occurred during the Great Fire of London.

Year 3 have had a busy second week diving into exciting new topics In Science, we began exploring our new topic: *Animals Including Humans*. We looked at different types of skeletons and even sang a catchy song to help us remember the names of our bones. In Maths, we continued our *Place Value* unit, working with numbers in the hundreds. We also explored number lines to 100, learning how to calculate intervals and estimate positions. In English, we started looking at *instructional writing* through our new class book *How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth*. The children have really enjoyed the humour in the text and are beginning to understand the features of good instructions. In History, we continued learning about the Stone Age. A real highlight was getting to hold and examine a real fossil spearhead discovered by archaeologists – an unforgettable hands-on experience!

Year 4 have been very busy using resources in Maths this week to help with partitioning numbers to 10,000. In English we are using the city of Pompeii as our inspiration for writing a setting description. In Science, we will be learning all about our teeth and how each type of tooth has a different function. We have been talking about how it feels to belong to a group in PSHE and have been relating this to belonging to our class.

Year 5 have been settling in fantastically well - we are very proud of them! The children have been excited to learn more about Space in Science. This week we learnt about the Earth being a sphere. In Geography, we learnt about the UK's biome and various ecosystems. Maths has been all about place value and ensuring we know how to read and write numbers to 1,000,000. In English, we have started to learn about audience and purpose.


Year 6 have been writing a non-chronological report about the thanator, a creature from Pandora. In Maths we have continued developing our place value knowledge up to 10 million, including ordering and comparing numbers. Within our History lesson, we have learnt what events caused the Battle of Britain and in Computing we are learning how variables can be used when programming in order to keep scores in a game. We are continuing to read the Midnight Guardians, a book based around an evacuee during WW2.
