The River Ganges is considered to be sacred and spiritually pure by believers although in reality it is not a clean river. Because of the purifying nature of the river, Sanatanis believe that any rituals performed on the banks of the Ganges or in its water will wash away impurity. <i>The Puranas</i> (ancient Sanatani scriptures) say that taking a dip in the sacred river ‘bestows heavenly blessings’.</p>	<p><b>Key Question:</b> Has Christmas lost its true meaning? <b>Religion:</b> Christianity <b>Theme:</b> Incarnation <b>Sticky Knowledge</b> God chose a Jewish young woman called Mary, who was engaged to Joseph the carpenter, to be the mother of his earthly son. As part of his ministry, narrated in the New Testament of the Bible, Jesus performed many miracles. The miracles included in this enquiry are based on healing (rather than some others which create e.g. food and drink). He is present in the Trimurti and all other deities. Shiva and Parvati are believed to be parents to Ganesha. Due to him not realising Ganesha was his son, Shiva cut off his head so replaced it with the head of the nearest sleeping animal which was an elephant. Theme: Rights of passage and good works <b>Religion:</b> Judaism <b>Theme:</b> Beliefs and Practices <b>Sticky Knowledge</b> *Abraham is the founder of Judaism and that he made a covenant or an agreement with God. *Jewish marriage is seen as a public commitment making ceremony and therefore a sincere desire to lead a good life. *Mitzvoth means doing good and helping others. *Tikkun Olam (repair of the world) is to perform an act of kindness that will improve or help to repair the world. *Tu B'Shevat: this is an annual tree planting ceremony which usually takes place in January or February. These rules are contained within the mitzvot (613 laws or commandments). *Following these food laws shows obedience to God and self-control. *Food that is allowed is called kosher. *Passover is an annual Jewish festival that takes place in spring. Families share a Seder meal together. The Israelites marked their doorposts with lamb's blood so that they would be safe from final plague in Moses and the baby story. It explicitly asks God to grant the speaker forgiveness as they forgive others who have hurt them.</p>	<p><b>Key Question:</b> Does Celebrating Shavuot make Jewish children feel closer to god? <b>Religion:</b> Judaism <b>Theme:</b> Festivals <b>Sticky Knowledge</b> *Shavuot is also known as the Feast of Weeks. Shavuot has no fixed date and is the least celebrated of all Jewish festivals. *Many years ago, Jewish people would harvest their first wheat and fruits. These would be taken to the Temple in a special basket to be blessed. This ritual is called Bikkurim. *Shavuot is the only time Jews might desire to study all night. This is known as Tikkun. *Prayer is an important part of the Shavuot celebration</p>	<p><b>Key Question:</b> Do people need to go to church to show they are Christians? <b>Religion:</b> Christianity <b>Theme:</b> Prayer and Worship <b>Sticky Knowledge</b> *Jesus taught about worship in the Bible and praying . *Baptism is generally a rite for babies although adults can choose to be baptised later in life. It confers the name of the person and their part in God's family. *Many Christians would choose to get married in church to confer God's blessing on the marriage. *Churches frequently have art or symbols which may remind the Christian of his or her beliefs or the life of Jesus or other figures from the Bible or later saints. *The feelings a place evokes as well as the building and what happens there may be one of the reasons a Christian would choose to go to church.</p>

Allah, who is perfect justice, will decide on your next step after looking at the evidence collected during your life. The evidence is collected by 2 angels who record your thoughts words and deeds. This belief should mean that Muslims try to do the right thing. Allah will be fair and just, so your afterlife should be what you deserve. The enquiry looks at ways in which Muslims could improve their chances of a good afterlife for example, Muslims can live a good life by: asking Allah for forgiveness, doing good deeds, praying regularly, fasting during Ramadan and giving to those in need.
